Check Your Car's Tire Inflation Pressure

Tire pressure affects safety handling

The highway presents the biggest risk of injury to your family. Tire pressure affects your car's emergency stops and maneuvers. Check the inflation pressure of your tires at least once a month.

According to the Rubber Manufacturers Association only 1 in 7 drivers regularly checks tire pressure once a month. Yet 3 out of 4 drivers wash their car once a month.

What is the correct pressure?

The correct tire pressure is listed in your car's manual or on a label on the car, such as on an inside door post. The tire pressure imprinted on the sidewall of the tire is not the correct pressure.

Check tires when they are cold

Check your tire pressure when the tires are still cold. Don't check pressure after they get hot from driving a distance.

Get a tire gauge

Buy a good tire pressure gauge and store it in your glove compartment. When it comes to your family's safety, little things mean a lot.
